### This Week: Hope Hines Speaker, Author, News & Radio

Hope Hines is best known by most as the sports newscaster for CBS NewsChannel 5, where he worked for thirty two years. He is highly respected around the nation as a seasoned professional and play-by-play broadcaster, his career has spanned over forty years as a broadcaster.

Hope joined NewsChannel 5 as Sports Director in 1971 after graduating from the University of Georgia. In 1975, Hope left for San Diego and announced for the San Diego Chargers and later for the New Orleans Saints in New Orleans, eventually continuing on to Baltimore where he broadcast for the Baltimore Colts. In 1983 Hope returned to Nashville. Hope he has been named Best Sports caster in the Southeast, and has received an Iris Award for the best produced half hour sports program in television. Recently, Hope was named a recipient of the Silver Circle Award by the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for 25 Years of Distinguished Service to the Industry.

The title of Clifton's book comes from the idea that many great companies, in particular Ford, were founded and successful because they 'did the right thing'. ### End Polio Now We are THIS Close

Fred Heitman recently reported on the progress made by Rotary in its efforts to end polio worldwide. Twenty-five years ago there were 1000 new cases of the disease **every day**. Last year there were 1349 cases worldwide. There are four countries where the disease is endemic: India, Pakistan, Nigeria, and Afganistan. The area around the border between Pakistan and Afganistan is especially troublesome because it is a war zone where volunteers cannot go to administer vaccine. Last year there were only 232 cases in endemic countries, and there were 1117 cases in non-endemic countries. Even in the endemic countries cases are down.
